On Tuesday, Year 6 gave an inspiring assembly on Ancient Greece and showed the beautiful models of the Parthenon they had made.

In Maths, children learned about positional language: forwards, backwards, right, left, clockwise and anti-clockwise. See if they can turn a quarter turn clockwise this weekend! They also found fractions of numbers, using a bead string to split 20 into 4 equal parts.



In English, children revised suffixes and conjunctions, something they had difficulty with in the assessment. They also practised writing 'adjective, adjective noun' as a writing technique in their stories.

Congratulations to the children for coming in wearing amazing costumes for World Book Day. Children tried to read as much as possible during the day and even managed to read 4 books in one day!
