

The Storm Owl


The Storm Owl is a beautiful, shy bird that brings great luck to anyone who meets it. The last person to see a Storm Owl was a man called Professor Pickety, but that was many, many years ago. How would you like to meet this fascinating bird?

What does it look like?

The Storm Owl is very unusual. It is bigger than most owls and has a long feather that sticks out from the middle of its head like a lightning bolt. All Storm Owls have the blackest of black feathers, but every owl has its very own feather pattern of flashes of gold and silver down its back and across each wing. Baby storm owls have glittery white feathers when they are born.

Where does it live?

The Storm Owl lives in the forest. It is a nocturnal bird and is very shy so it is not often seen. In the daytime, it sleeps deep in the branches of the biggest trees, hidden by the leaves. At night, the Storm Owl swoops from branch to branch in the trees at the side of moonlit pools. It lives in small family groups which can be as large as ten owls and owlets.



What does it eat?
