Maths:


Patterns are everywhere! We looked at matching animal patterns to the words and completing colour patterns. During our lessons, we have some super volunteers to lead The Pause!





We loved seeing all the wonderful book characters on World Book Day! The Nursery was filled with superheros, wicked witches, wild animals and magical creatures!




