

Literacy:

The Ugly Duckling has been our story of the week and it has been a great stimulus for us to discuss how everyone is different and how to be accepting. We saw how sad the little duckling was when the other birds said he looked strange so we had a great discussion about the impact of our words. We also made a story map which helped us retell the story.





Maths:

- Can we kindly ask for you to refrain from bringing toys into Nursery. We are finding it tricky to keep track of them and cannot be responsible if they go missing or break.
- We go to the Library every Thursday, so please send your library books back on a Wednesday or a Thursday so that the children can choose a new book.
- Thank you so much for sending in the pictures of your child for their timeline poster. We would like to invite parents to come and have a look at our projects on Monday the 25^{th} at drop off.
- Grandparents morning is the 27th of March from 10:45-11:30 which will be pick-up time. Join us in making some Easter baskets and an Easter egg hunt! If a grandparent is not able to make the event, another relative or friend is welcome. If this is not possible, please do not worry as all children will still have lots of fun with the teachers!
