

4I Newsletter: Spring Term 2, Week 2

This week in 4I..

In English, the children finished writing their innovated stories. They swapped books and provided each other with feedback in the form of 'two stars, one wish'. They then edited their work and read their stories aloud, which was fantastic!

In Maths, the children practised problem solving with improper fractions and learned how to convert mixed numbers to improper fractions.

The children learned about the mountain ranges in India in their Geography lesson. They had to identify the features of the different ranges and write a couple of descriptive sentences about each one.

In RS, we are focusing on Christianity for the rest of the half term and learned about The Last Supper. The children looked at Da Vinci's depiction of the parable and through discussion, identified what symbols lay within the image.

In Science, the children began learning their new topic 'States of Matter'. They looked at a range of items and identified which ones were solids or liquids. We concluded that whilst some items may seem to be in a certain state, the features of a solid and liquid need to be applied fully and you therefore need to look an item's shape, movement and consistency carefully!
