- As usual, this week's homework is in the yellow folder. Pupils have been given until Wednesday 20th March to complete all tasks as best as they are able to. The Spelling and Maths tasks should take 20-25 minutes. This week, the English homework is to polish our lines for the play. Mrs Cook has asked everyone to know their cues and their entrances as well as their line. Thank you, parents, for helping with this.
- May we ask parents of children who are expected to be absent on a Friday to email the school office with a request for homework to be sent directly to the school office. If your child is absent due to illness, we will ensure they are issued with the correct homework upon their return to school. This is to ensure that your child is given sufficient time to recuperate and that parents are not disturbed over the weekend with requests for copies or photos of homework sheets. It also ensures the correct homework is given to each child, as it is adapted to suit them. In the meantime, absent children can always do

plenty of reading, or use our excellent online resources (TTRS and Oxford Reading Buddies).

- Please do ensure you are listening to your child read aloud as much as possible ideally on a daily basis, filling in the yellow reading record. We would encourage quality reading of 10-15 minutes (including discussion) rather than lengthy sessions of page turning! Even though your child may not finish a book every night, they always need to bring their reading book and reading record to school every day.
- Some children are using Times Tables Rockstars (TTRS) regularly and we are already seeing the benefit in class. We are going to be giving extra House Point rewards to pupils who do this, so please do encourage your child to use this excellent resource. Ms Foster has stipulated that each week **TTRS must be played in Garage Mode only**, for 2 x 5 minute sessions.
