## What have we explored this week?

In English this week, the children have been learning about hyphens and enjoyed exploring words that need a hyphen to avoid ambiguity! For example:

The man eating shark was on the loose.

Vs.

The man-eating shark was on the loose.

In Maths, the children have welcomed the challenge of percentages and finding their equivalent fractions and decimals. Our next topic will focus on calculating the perimeter and area of 2D shapes.

During Science, the children conducted research into a range of endangered animals and began creating posters, leaflets and speeches to present to their classmates next week!

In History, learning about the Shang Dynasty saw the children comparing evidence from history books against archaeological evidence to try to place the Shang kings in chronological order.
