Seahorses Class

We have been exploring the colour green this week; the children loved painting leaves, mixing up green using yellow and blue paint and going on a colour hunt outside.









<u>Literacy:</u> Our Traditional tale this week is 'The Enormous Turnip'. The children are able to recite the story and sequence it. The children loved retelling the story with pictures from the storytelling basket. They were able to do this in small groups and perform it for the class.

Phonics:

Our sound of the week is 'F'! We learnt the Jolly Phonics song and practised forming the letter using the interactive board, books and worksheets. The children played a game of silly soup looking for objects that began with F for our yummy soup. We also had a go at sorting all our previous sounds into groups helping us identify and consolidate previous sounds.





Maths:

We have been learning all about ordinal numbers this week. The children had great fun ordering all the toys when they had a race. We also had lots of fun playing races and ordering ourselves.

<u>Topic:</u> We have been learning all about North and South America. We have learnt about the Amazon Jungle and learnt all about the different foods and animals you can find.

Capybara




