What have we explored this week?

In Science, we have continued to explore electricity. The children made circuits which included bulbs, buzzers and batteries. They also learned the scientific symbols for the components of a circuit and practised drawing them.



Maths has been focused on angles. Children have been practising their protractor skills and learning rules for calculating missing angles. We are also engrossed in our 'Enterprise Project', with the children working hard on their pitch presentations to secure their budget.

Our English learning has centred on vocabulary and grammar. We have been revising how to write the different types of past tense verbs – these will be used when writing our adventure flashbacks.

In Philosophy, we enjoyed discussing closed and open questions about the painting, *'An Experiment on a Bird in an Air Pump* 'by Joseph Wright



PSHE Update

In PSHE over the coming weeks, our lessons will focus on puberty and human reproduction. The lessons will cover:
