What have we explored this week?

It has been so helpful to meet with you all at the PTI's this week. Thank you for your time and support.

In Maths we have been learning to understand numbers from 50 to 100. The children learnt to find missing numbers on a number line, partition whole numbers into tens and ones and find one more and less than numbers to 100. The children learnt to understand that the tens number represents groups of ten and the ones mean how many extra. The children learnt to see it visually first using objects such as straws and cubes.

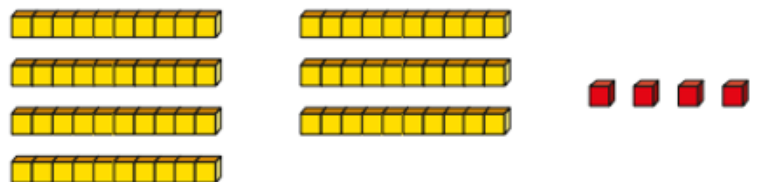

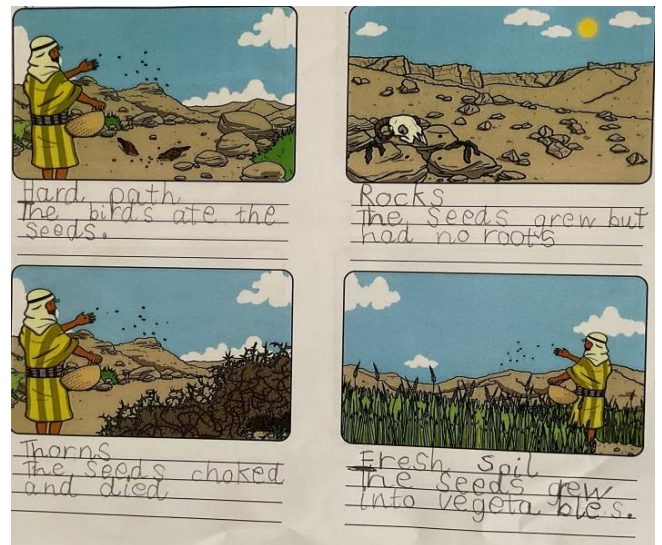

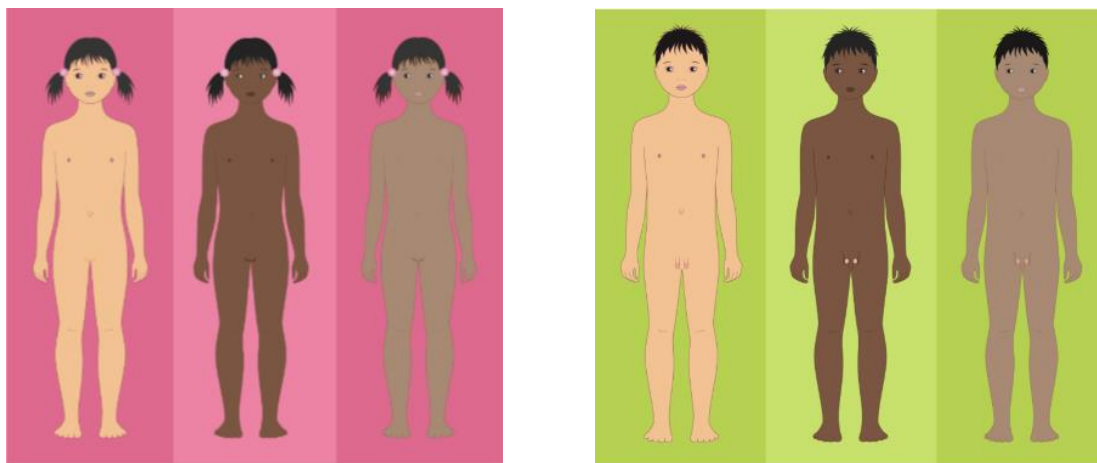


In English we filled in our story map, drawing in our main character, the creature that is lost, and some stormy weather. We spoke the story aloud to our partners. This is the 'Talk' part of the Talk for Writing process. Then we started our transcription, which is the writing. We have started with simple sentences, and are remembering to use neat writing, and correct spelling and punctuation.

In RS the children learned the parable 'The Sower'. They listened to the story, watched a video and then discussed the significance of seeds trying to grow on a rock, hard path, in thorns and fresh soil. The message was, if you accept learning, listen carefully and allow for it flourish you can grow knowledge, wisdom and pass it on. It's the state of the learner; so let's pause, breathe and find present awareness.



In PSHEE we continued to learn about body changes. This week we explored male and female private body parts using the words penis, testicles, vulva, vagina and anus. We looked at what is the same and what is different. We encourage the children to use correct vocabulary and only show their private parts to people they are very close to and feel comfortable around, i.e. their family or a doctor. The children were very sensible and realise although they are private it is ok to discuss them in a safe space.
